Welcome to all and thank you for attending the ASC business meeting. We have been working on several things over the last six months or so, and much has been accomplished. Many of the changes that were necessary to improve the function of this body have taken place. We have taken some steps toward improving the relationships between this body and the subcommittees that work for it. We have found ways to implement solutions that are the result of the groups and individuals that participated in the area inventory process. Lawrence has been working to assist the H&I subcommittees of the outlying areas, and Vera has been working with those areas from a PR standpoint. Gene has had some struggles with the Activities Committee, though he has discussed them at the Administrative committee meeting and is working toward some goals. As a group we talked about the issues and shared ideas. I believe that this open communication combined with application of the core principles; Honesty, Open-mindedness, and Willingness is the key to sustaining a healthier ASC. There is still a lot of work to be done as we continue to find a way to work with our fellow addicts in the Tualitin Valley, and Greater Willamette areas. ### New Business:

H&I spoke with Alpha House men's treatment facility about possibly ending our commitments there due to lack of participation by the facility. Attendance has picked up since that discussion and for now we will still be serving that facility.

H&I has been talking with Coffee Creek women's prison about the lack of communication between the panel chair, chair of H&I, and the volunteer coordinator at the prison. Some of our volunteers have been down two and three times to bring a meeting in and have been turned away because the paperwork that was supposed to be there wasn't. It has been difficult getting any type of response either over the phone or by email from the volunteer coordinator. We are temporarily suspending all meetings until we can get some consistency with visitations and some clear answers to the situation at hand.

## **III. Phoneline: David G**

Hotline met on September 20th and discussed merging our subcommittee with public relations. A motion to merge was voted on and passed (9 to 2 in favor) . We also discussed the reoccurring problem of the phoneline shutting down! We are currently looking into several options to resolve this problem. Currently there are three open shifts they are Tuesday 7am to 12pm, Tuesday 11pm to 7am, and Wednesday 7am to 12pm Our Adhoc committee will be meeting on October 11th to begin writing our new guidelines hopefully they will be ready for AREA in December. We are excited about the changes we are making and that the Portland area meetings approve of these changes.

## **IV. Public Relations: Vera K**

Another busy month for Public Relations. I was asked to attend the Metro meeting this month to discuss the possibilities of shared services with TVA and GWVA in regards to the schedule in the event of the possible disbandment of the Metro. We are discussing shared services but no decisions have been made at this point.

Public Relations is working on getting ad placements in our local papers. So far we will have ad placement in the "Busted" paper in next month's addition. We are planning to have ads in the Oregonian, the Mercury, and Willamette Weekly. I hope to have more to report on that next month.

Public Relations and Phoneline held a vote at our meetings last week to have Phoneline come under the umbrella of Public Relations. Phoneline is one of the most important ways that we relate to the public and our combined efforts work well together and provide support. We are still ironing out the details of what that entails and we hope to present this to Area with our guidelines for Area's approval. We have a meeting set up for the 11th of October to start working on our guidelines.

The other important way we relate to the public is through our schedule. We now have the two page schedule! The extra page allowed us to create a schedule that serves our community in an inclusive way which helps all addicts seeking recovery and meetings in Multnomah, Clackamas, Washington, and Clark County Areas. There are a lot of changes and we encourage you to take time out and look over all the wonderful things that we are now able to provide in the new schedule because of the extra room. Linda R. has spent a great many hours devoted to working on this schedule over the past few months to provide accurate and vital information for our Area. Big thanks to Linda R.!!!! We welcome your input because this is after all Everyone's Schedule we just ask that you email us or attend our meeting and we would be more than happy to consider your requests.

Still working on the 12th Step volunteer training/orientation. I have received some input and there are some changes that need to be made to the document and more work to be done. Stay tuned.

Public Relations committee is strong and thriving; we are working very hard on unity and providing information to the public about Narcotics Anonymous. We are still in need of a Web-Host alternate and a Media Coordinator and a few other positions on PR. So if you are interested in any of these positions please contact Andrea our web-host or me or simply come to our PR meeting at the end of the month.

#### **RCM Report: Michael McD**

Good Afternoon, I am happy to be back here with you all. I have only a few things to discuss today so hopefully this will be brief.

1. Activities: as you may have heard Activities is having some serious problems. For the first time I have been called by a member to discuss the problems and the perceived lack of leadership. They need help in the running of the meeting itself as well as in creating some baseline budgeting standards for events. Hopefully I will be able to assist in this.

2. Literature remains to date unaccountable; hopefully you will have heard something about this and some solutions.
3. Our inventory: We have not completed all of the implementation of the solutions that the ASC agreed to. This has to become a higher priority with the Admin committee.
4. I have been attending Metro meetings for about five months now. At the last meeting Travis and Vera attended with me. There was a lot of attendance there because the TVA ASC had directed their RCM to go to Metro to discuss disbanding the Metro Committee. It appears that TVA will vote to disband and if that happens, the Metro will no longer exist. We have committed to TVA and GWA to find a way to provide some shared services in at least the schedule as well as possibly a Tri Area phone line service. All of this is preliminary but discussions are planned for further cooperation.
  - a. Addendum from Lisa T. MCM TVA: On behalf of TVANA I would like to share with you where we are in regard with Metro. Hopefully this will clear up some possible confusion or miscommunication. TVANA did not send their RCM to Metro. There was a proposal made by one of the home groups of our area. This proposal asked that the executive bodies of TVA and GWV meet to discuss Metro and accountability of the schedule if Metro was disbanded. There was a friendly amendment to include phone line. This proposal was approved at the August ASC. At this time a proposal has been sent to the groups of TVA asking whether or not they want to continue with Metro. Without direction from our groups, it is not possible to say what our position as a whole will be. We should have an answer to this at our next ASC, Nov. 1, 2009. I understand your report was written, based on the information available to you. I do appreciate your cooperation and this opportunity to add some information that may have been unclear. Thank you for your time and support to help all areas of NA to work together.

Steve R and I need volunteers to help us host the Regional Weekend planned for February. If anyone is interested in working on this event please let us know.

We will also be planning a Portland Area Conference Agenda workshop for the PASC GSRs and interested members. We will distribute the Conference Agenda Reports prior to those meetings. Each Group that attends the ASC meeting in January will receive a Conference Agenda Report (CAR - see below for more information).

CAR: Every two years the service structure of NA comes together for a world meeting that is attended by regional delegates from countries and regions of countries. Before that meeting an agenda, outlining the proposed business, is published and distributed to all ASCs. This usually occurs in November. The proposed business includes motions presented by the world board, ongoing or newly proposed projects, and regional motions that did not come from the world board. In addition, at the world conference new business is heard and motions are made from

the floor by conference delegates. At the end of November or beginning of December the PASC will hold a workshop to discuss and vote on the items contained in the CAR this information will then be relayed to region where voting will also take place and eventually be carried to the world meeting by delegates. **Open Forum**

Will A: requested that when the admin committee submits reports that they leave out words such as “perceived”, “you may have heard” because he feels this sends a negative message.

Allen M: talked about group conscious and the importance of the traditions, stating that it is not ok to make commitments to other areas and then fail to follow through.

Teresa E: Her home group would like to donate money that would be earmarked for insurance coverage. This was discussed at the BOD meeting and it was concluded that this was not an option under our current bylaws. This would also set a precedent for groups to earmark their donations which would make it difficulty if not impossible for the treasurer to do business. If a group would like to donate extra money to area and to specify how they would like it to be spent this would certainly be taken into consideration.

Discussion and questions about the insurance: this would cover all groups, activities, and the executive committee. We passed a motion a few months ago giving permission for the area to spilt the cost of insurance with activities. However, we have no line item in the budget for insurance and no money has been set aside at this point.

Carol: Talked about the importance of sponsorship and friendship and how this has helped her get back into the program.

Nannette: Activities is requesting that the PASC take over the planning and production of the workshop day. A room has been reserved but not paid for and there is a financial commitment

from activities for \$300 and from TVA for \$100. An additional \$400 is needed.

Michael McD: The body has been in support of this event and feels that the PASC can provide coordination and planning if the body agrees. However, we will still need some assistance from activities.

Wally: If we decide to take on this event how would we proceed, with an ad hoc committee?

Michael McD: This would likely be an ad hoc and we can take a straw poll now to see if the majority would like it to happen.

Troy: Our area inventory did recommend that our area provide more training opportunities.

Straw poll: majority of GSR's in support of the PASC taking over the planning of the workshop day.

Will A: If anyone knows leaders in the community that would be willing to make a commitment to help take a lead, we need to encourage others to be of service.

Samantha: Was invited to activities last month and felt that it was a mess, people were disrespectful and she was embarrassed and is wondering if there is anything that the PASC is going to do to help make this situation better.

Travis: The admin committee discussed this and appointed two people to go and co-facilitate the next activities subcommittee meeting. The leadership of activities is aware of the issues and has asked for and wants help. This is also being looked into as part of the inventory process.

Travis: At the BOD we realized that there are two different dates listed for the October meeting so we will take a vote to see if we will meet on the 31<sup>st</sup> or the 24<sup>th</sup>.

- Activities: Subcommittee leaders and members have expressed frustration about the lack of cohesion and spirituality at their meetings. In addition, there are concerns about discrepancies with the finances. Gene and Michael have not gotten together yet to review processes, budgeting, and events.
  - Gene appreciates having someone from the admin committee to help him facilitate but believes that others on the subcommittee are antagonized by this. The admin committee is not trying to mandate how to run the subcommittee but we are concerned about the lack of efficiency and accountability and authority on the part of the chair person.
  - Discussed the need for creating budgets for each event that every expense needs to be documented so that there is accountability.
  - Discussed the need to revise the bylaws and try to make the subcommittee more manageable and easier to facilitate and thus able to complete necessary business. Also discussed using an agenda with time limits and if a decision can not be made in a set time period than business moves on the body will have to deal with the consequences. This is how we learn.
